Reading at Rye: At the end of last term, I took a group of teachers to hear Di Snowball speak on reading. This is the second group of teachers to hear her and what she says is directing our teaching of reading at Rye Primary School. You may remember some time ago there was a TV program about Kambrya College where they brought in educational experts to support them to transform their school. Di Snowball was the expert who transformed their approach to reading. Di talked about lots of things we can do at school but she also talked about what parents and carers can do to support children on their reading journey.

Some of the things she said were:


- Children need access to good literature, fiction and non fiction.
- Reading to children as well as hearing children read is vital.
- Repetition is important as it helps children develop fluency and skills. *(so be tolerant if they want to revisit a favourite book night after night!)*
- Parents need to be reading role models. It is vital that children see their parents read and especially important for them to see males as readers. *(Apparently there is even some research linking healthier children to parents who read.)*
- Smart readers read books they understand and enjoy.
- If a child is desperate to read a book that is too hard, consider borrowing it as an audio book from the library. *(Don't allow audio books to take the place of actual reading though.)*
- Join the public library and visit often.
- It is a good idea to allow children to read silently first then read aloud. This helps them to read more fluently.
- Ask your children what his or her reading goal is. All our students should be able to tell you what they are working on in reading. *(if they can't tell you, it might be worth checking with their teacher.)*
