



RYE PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY 2013

Students are required to wear full Rye Primary school uniform of red and blue as detailed in this policy. This policy has been developed through consultation between the Rye Primary School Council and the Principal. Our uniform reflects the value of our school community and was devised to create a feeling of unity and connectedness within our school. Students can wear this uniform with pride and be easily identified as member of the Rye Primary School Community.

Our uniform is functional and allows students to actively participate in all elements of school life.

Upon enrolment all students and parents will be provided with a copy of the Rye Primary School Uniform policy to ensure that they are fully conversant with the expectations of our school regarding dress code. The School Council will ensure that the items listed in our Uniform Policy are readily available to all members of our school community.

Uniform Policy Rules

It is expected that all students will wear full school uniform on a daily basis. This includes during excursions, school celebrations and during extra-curricular activities unless otherwise stipulated by the Rye Primary School Staff or School Council. Students will be notified in writing on those occasions when they are not required to wear full school uniform. EG: When attending school camp, sporting events, free dress days etc.

- Students who fail to comply with the Rye Primary School Uniform Policy will face sanctions depending on their age, personal circumstances and the consistency of their failure to adhere to the uniform policy.
- Students who fail to wear uniform are expected to present a note to their classroom teacher explaining the reasons for non compliance to the uniform policy.
- Students who fail to provide a notice will be sent to the school administration where they will receive a verbal warning.

- Students who continue to fail to comply with the School Uniform Policy will receive a notice to take home to be signed by a parent or guardian and returned to the school administration.
- A Student who continues to fail to comply with the Uniform Policy will face restricted play through detention until he/she is attired in uniform. At this stage the student's parent will be invited to the school to come to a suitable solution.

Defined Uniform

Uniform will be available from the uniform shop or the second hand uniform shop.

Windcheater –Navy with school logo

Bomber Jacket –Navy with school logo

Vest –Navy with school logo

Polo shirt – Red or Navy with school logo – short sleeve and long sleeve

Pants – Cargo/track pants in navy.

Shorts – Plain/Cargo in navy.

Hats – Navy with logo – broad brimmed, (terms one and four compulsory)

School dress – Blue, White and navy

Blue or black Leggings can be worn as an under garment only and must be accompanied by shorts, skirts or dresses.

Students are also expected to wear appropriate, safe footwear. This excludes sandals, thongs, crocs, high heels and roller shoes. School shoes in black or tan or runner style shoes are appropriate school wear.

Personal Code

Safety for all students is of the utmost important at Rye Primary School. For this reason we will not allow students to wear any piercings except stud ear rings.

Students are not to wear any jewellery with the exception of watches.

School Council agree that students with hair styles that the School Administration deems inappropriate will have parents contacted to arrange a more acceptable hair style.

Free Dress Days

Student free dress days must be approved by School Council and limited to not more than five in a school year.
